BAHNO Council is delighted to announce that the next BAHNO President will be **Professor Chris Nutting**. Following this year's AGM Professor Nutting will take up the position of President Elect, taking over the role of President in 2025.

Council is pleased to note that 50% of all members eligible to vote actually did so, leading to an exceptionally close contest. Professor Nutting's tenure will be the first for a Clinical Oncologist.

BAHNO Annual Scientific Meeting – 17th May 2024

Have you booked your place at the BAHNO meeting, yet? There are still some EarlyBird rate tickets available – please **DO** book in advance as there will be difficulties if you try and register on the day.

The theme of the conference is <u>Data and Outcomes in Head and Neck Cancer</u>.

The Blair Hesketh Memorial Lecture will be given by Professor George Davey Smith: *Chasing down causes in observational data –Triangulation of evidence in practice.*

Because of the larger venue, there will be even more opportunities to tailor the meeting to your particular educational needs – over 20 free papers and presentations by the GIRFT team and an update on the proposed new National Audit. Of special interest to trainees, there will be a session led by people who have negotiated the grants and awards pathway already – interested in applying for a Fellowship? NEW! BAHNO Accredited Short Fellowships

BAHNO members may apply for an ASF which offers the successful applicant the opportunity to spend a short but focused period of time at a centre/unit offering a specific learning experience. We are currently proposing a onemonth period, but this period can be flexible according to the host unit and applicant.

This round of fellowships will offer positions as follows:

- Clinical Oncology fellowship at The Christie Hospital (Manchester) with the focus being Proton Beam Therapy.
- Multidisciplinary fellowship at UCL (London) with exposure to Sentinel Lymph Node Biopsy for Head & Neck aimed at any specialty involved with this technique.

We anticipate that as the period of time is short it will cause minimal disruption at the applicant's home unit. BAHNO is offering an award of £2500 towards accommodation, travel and necessary expenses.

BAHNO is committed to supporting equality, diversity and Inclusion. Applications are encouraged to reflect the broad community of BAHNO membership and any adjustments to the fellowship required for the candidate will be accommodated.

Applicants should apply to BAHNO (<u>secretariat@bahno.org.uk</u>) with:

- A letter explaining their motivation and what they wish to obtain from the fellowship.
- The applicant's up-to-date CV.
- Details of two current referees.
- Written evidence of provisional approval for them to take time away from their unit if applicable.

The applicant must agree to provide a structured report to BAHNO following the fellowship and should agree to its publication on the BAHNO website. The closing date for applications is **Sunday April 21st (at midnight).** We expect to announce the successful applicants at our annual scientific meeting (17th May). The detailed plan of timing for the fellowship will be arranged by the applicant and host unit.
